Course Description

Horror is one of the most beloved genres in American cinema. In this course, we will explore five of the most enduring horror subgenres: the slasher film, the haunted house film, the home invasion film, the monster film, and the cosmic horror film. Through analysis of the films themselves, as well as through exploration of the films historical and cultural contexts, we will shine a light on the darkest corners of the American psyche, looking for all the fears: interpersonal, economic, existential that we're too afraid to face and too ashamed to admit. This is a course about horror movies, and we will therefore be exposed to disturbing images of violence, trauma, and sexuality each week.

Learning Outcomes

After completing this course, you will be able to:

- Describe the horror genre and its key features
- Discuss, in both verbal and written discourse, select works of horror
- Analyze such works closely in written discourse
- think and write critically about the representation of phenomena such as subjectivity, gender, violence, desire and social status in such works

Learning Strategies and Resources

A variety of learning strategies will be employed, including at-home screenings, video lectures, online discussions, quizzes, scholarly readings, and a final video presentation.

Learning Deliverables

Discussion Posts: Students are expected to do the appropriate reading and screening for each class module in a timely fashion. They are also expected to demonstrate that they have done so by participating on discussion boards. You can find guidelines for the journal entries in the "Assignment" section of the course's D2L website, as well as at the end of this syllabus.

Quizzes: Each week there will be a D2L quiz on the video lectures; these will return grades instantly, and students will have one chance to take each quiz.

Final Presentation: During finals week, each student will submit a recorded presentation (8–10 minutes) on a horror film of their choosing, analyzed through the lens of the concepts introduced throughout the quarter.
