Course Description

All the many experiences of your life provide opportunities for learning skills and knowledge that you developed in the workplace, your community or as the result of a particular interest. Prior learning assessment (PLA) is the process by which we surface as much of our knowledge on a topic as possible and articulate it as clear concepts so that an assessor can evaluate our knowledge for college credit. Given the complexity of the brain, this process requires techniques that promote reflection, articulation and documentation. If you have a particular skill or knowledge set that you can match to learning outcomes, this class will engage you in that process so that you may accomplish the documentation of what you know. In the process, you will become skilled in the task of knowledge transfer, an ability increasingly in demand by organizations.

Eligibility for PLA Credit

PLA credit is available for students enrolled in SCPS programs. Restrictions apply in terms of transfer credit applied and hours completed in student programs. Contact your academic advisor to determine if RPL 101 fits into your program and if you have requirements available to accomodate PLA credit in your program.
