Fall 2023 Course Descriptions

CAN 300 – Cannabis, Race and Justice – 4 credit hours – All quarter (9/6/23 – 11/21/23) – Lincoln Park Campus – Wednesdays – Course meets from 5:30pm – 8:45pm.

This course investigates issues related to race and equity in the recreational cannabis sector. It examines the impact of, among other issues, the industry's commercial landscape and concerns about 'Big Cannabis' as an emerging yet not universal corporatized model, cultural proclivities toward natural and preventive medicine as well as race-related disparities in the cannabis universe. The latter includes a focus on the various regional strategies to resolve disproportionate, race-based arrest and incarceration rates pre-legalization, social equity and licensing programs for cannabis entrepreneurs, teenage marijuana use and the overall state of numerous social justice movements to address these and other racial issues connected to this industry.

CCA 342 - Learning Art History: A Chicago Excursion Course – 2 or 4 credit hours – All quarter (9/6/23 – 11/21/23) – Loop Campus - Sundays – Course meets from 1:00 – 4:15pm

Whether you already appreciate art or have never been to The Art Institute of Chicago—this course is for you. One of the nation's finest art museums, The Art Institute of Chicago houses the largest collection of French

Impressionist paintings outside of Paris, France. In this course, you will study great works of art from Greece and Rome, the Middle Ages, and the Renaissance, Baroque, Rococo, Romantic, Impressionist, Post-Impressionist, and Modern periods. Students will learn art history; how to study a painting; overall periods, styles, and trends; and insights into artists' lives. You will learn how to enjoy art on a deeper level.

This in-person Fall course runs Sundays, September 10 through November 12, 2023, at 1:00-4:15pm. Each class session begins at The Art Institute of Chicago at Michigan and Adams in Chicago's Loop, then moves to a DePaul Loop Campus classroom for the second half of the class session. Instructor Joe Cunniff (jcunniff@depaul.edu) is a popular arts educator who also teaches the SCPS Chicago Excursion courses "Jazz and Chicago" and "Live Summer Music in Chicago."

BADM 230 – Managing Remote Teams – 2 credit hours – Second five-weeks (10/11/23 - 11/21/23) – Online Async

Before COVID made remote working common, corporations were examining how remote working strategies and logistics could be used to build cross functional remote teams in a creative way. Many employers were forced with an immediate need to move to remote working after Covid and are now challenged with how to manage this new type of workforce. This course will explore the challenges and opportunities with remote working, including legal considerations, manager/supervisory best practices, communication strategies, and technology utilization. Learners will be provided with conceptual and tactical learning through text, videos, articles, and deliverables that can be used in their workplace. This is an asynchronous course with optional Zoom sessions featuring special topics.

CCS 225 – Climate Change: Transforming Organizations for Sustainability – 2 or 4 credit hours – All quarter (9/6/23 – 11/21/23) Online Async

Climate change is the biggest challenge faced by society and organizations of all kinds can play a significant role in the transition to a sustainable society. In this course, students will gain knowledge concerning the latest scientific facts on climate change and the ecological crisis we face as well as how to make positive changes in their organizations. Students will learn about a range of tools to reframe cultural norms, both personally and professionally, and explore different perspectives concerning climate change. They will reflect on their personal leadership style and gain a 'big picture' view inspired by case studies featuring pioneering people and organizations who are collaborating to take radical action. The course is designed as a fully online interactive course based on asynchronous lectures, videos, podcasts, interactive exercises, quizzes, case studies, an individual project, discussion boards and knowledge assessments.

BADM 320 – Crisis Management – 2 or 4 credit hours – All quarter (9/6/23 – 11/21/23) – Online Async

Students will study different types of business crises including self-imposed events, natural occurrences, technology related events, financial shocks and social conflicts. Tools for anticipating and mitigating crises will be explored, including continuity of business plans, employee assistance plans, and communication plans targeted for all stakeholders. Case studies of management in a crisis environment across multiple industries and non-profit organizations will be a central theme in the course. Crisis management techniques used with different levels of success will include crisis leadership, crisis management teams, communication strategies and disciplined pursuit of objectives. Upon completion of the course students will have an understanding of how business crises can be anticipated, mitigated, navigated and successfully overcome.

CCH 306 – Travel and Learn in Boston: Exploring its Arts and History – Domestic Travel Course (2 or 4 credit hours – 10 weeks) Travel to Boston: 10/5 – 10/8 - Required Zoom sessions Fridays, 9/15, 9/22, 10/13, 11/3,

11/10 from 6:30 – 8:30pm

Boston is a city of many faces. It is a world-class city from a cultural and educational perspective by any standard, but it competes with New York City and Philadelphia for the title of best place for American history and art. Boston has fame for the riches made by old money profits but also for its colorful mob history. With such internal paradoxes and external competitors, why choose a travel course to Boston?

Here's why: In this domestic travel course, participants will walk the famous freedom train and other historic sites, visit Boston's famous art collections, and experience its diverse neighborhoods like Boston Common, Beacon Hill, and the North End. Issues such as Boston's immigrant populations, its fame as a seat of American higher education, its connection to events in American history, and its stake in the meaning of freedom and democracy will be discussed in the preparatory classes as well as in post travel learning as students work on individual projects.

Join us in fall quarter and travel with us to Boston to experience the multifaceted city of Boston for yourself!
