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Spring Term Course Descriptions

CAN 210 – Psychotropic Drugs in Modern American History – Lincoln Park/Flex – Wednesdays, 6-9:15pm – All quarter (3/29/25 – 6/13/25)

This course will engage you in inquiry about the intertwined social, political, and medical histories of psychotropic drugs, with an emphasis on the nineteenth and twentieth-century United States. A core thematic thread that runs throughout the course is how ideologies of race, class, and gender, as well as their institutional manifestations, have influenced the socioeconomic, political, legal, and medical statuses of drugs in US society. Broader contexts of international 'wars' on drugs, foreign trade, immigration, race relations, and medical pathologizations will be engaged as explanatory frameworks for understanding the so-called 'reefer madness' and similar discourses leading to the criminalization of marijuana and other psychotropics in the United States, in tandem with their prohibition through legislation and controlled-substance 'scheduling'. The more recent movements to legalize and decriminalize cannabis in its different forms, for both medical and recreational uses, offers a case-in-point for how psychotropic drugs in society are entangled with matters of racial justice. By engaging with this subject through the lens of science and technology studies, you will develop core competencies in understanding the role of science in society, civic engagement, and justice-based decision-making.

CCS 240 AI: Evolution/Application – Online: Asynchronous (Second Five Weeks 5/3/25 – 6/13/25)

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is already changing commerce, communication, education, healthcare, security, transportation, and has touched just about every aspect of our lives. An understanding of AI and Machine Learning (ML) is quickly becoming a basic requirement in virtually every job description. In this 5-week course, students will learn the history of AI, how it has evolved to what it is today, and gain hands-on experience in how it can be applied to solve real-world problems. Students will be exposed to the theories behind search algorithms, data classification, and how to draw predictions from raw data. By the end of the course, students will have the knowledge and practical experience to define and create their own applications for AI and ML.

The valuable techniques and materials from this course are applicable to virtually every occupation. **No prior experience in computer programming or other prerequisites are required.**

Domestic Travel – Spring Term 2025 (enrollment begins in February 2025)

LL 302 - Experiential Learning Practicum – Topic: The Wisdom and Power of Horses – Online Hybrid Spring Term 2025 – Day Retreat & fee: May 17, 2025 - \$100

The lives and destinies of humans and horses have been intricately interwoven since the beginning of history. In fact, horses are credited with being the species that most-revolutionized human culture. Horses have followed us onto the battlefield and carried us on life's journey for six-thousand years. Now that we no longer utilize these magnificent creatures as our 'beasts of burden', do horses have another destiny with regard to humankind? Currently, horses are partnering with people in vast ways, from the treatment of physical disabilities such as MS to helping combat veterans with PTSD. This course explores the ways in which horses can help over civilized

people connect with the wisdom and rhythms of the natural world and the role that horses (and other animals) play in human health and healing. Utilizing readings, films, instructor presentations, as preparation, the course highlight will be a day-long experiential learning retreat working with horses. Students will have a powerful, unique opportunity to explore ways in which horses facilitate healing, our connection to our instincts (and the natural world) and expand non-verbal awareness. No prior experience is necessary. **Retreat Experience & cost: May 17, 2025 - \$100 to be collected on the day of the retreat.** The highlight of this course is a day-long retreat with the instructor in southeast Wisconsin – just over the Illinois border about 1 hour from Chicago. The retreat will focus on connecting to nature and the horses with a variety of activities throughout the day. Continental breakfast, refreshments and lunch are provided.

CCH 306 - Travel and Learn in Boston – Domestic Travel 5/1/25 – 5/4/25. Zoom Synchronous class dates pre-travel: Fridays, 4/4 & 4/11 from 6-9PM CST and Saturday, 4/26 from 10AM-1PM and post travel: Fridays, 5/23 & 5/30 from 6-9PM CST.

Boston is a city of many faces. Culturally and educationally, it is no doubt a world-class city, yet it competes with New York City and Philadelphia for the title of best place to experience American history and art. Boston has fame for the riches made by old money profits but also for its colorful mob history. With such internal paradoxes and external competitors, why choose a travel course to Boston? Here is why: In this domestic travel course, participants will walk the famous freedom trail and other historic sites, visit Boston's famous art collections, and experience its diverse neighborhoods like Boston Common, Beacon Hill, and the North End. Issues such as Boston's immigrant populations, its fame as a seat of American higher education, its connection to events in American history, and its stake in the meaning of freedom and democracy will be discussed in the preparatory classes as well as in post travel learning as students work on individual projects. This high impact travel course involves online classes preparing for travel that meet Zoom synchronously Fridays, 4/4 and 4/11 from 6-9pm, and Saturday, 4/26 from 10 am – 1pm. There will also be post travel Zoom synchronous sessions on Fridays, 5/23 & 5/30 from 6-9pm debriefing from a long weekend after traveling—the evening of **5/1/2025, 6pm EST through the afternoon of 5/4/2025, 2pm EST**— the travel will be spent learning on site in the city of Boston. An additional course fee of \$275.00 will be applied to each student's account for group admissions costs and students will cover their own airfare, food, and accommodation expenses while in Boston.

LL 302 - Experiential Learning Practicum – Topic: Mindfulness Retreat – Domestic Travel – Retreat at Starved Rock – May 29 – June 1, 2025.

This course is designed to provide students with both academic knowledge and first-hand experiential understanding of mindfulness meditation. Students will focus on developing personal and professional skills through reflection and engagement with course content. It provides students with a deep understanding of mindfulness meditation, its various techniques, benefits, and investigation of its broader ethical applications such as compassion, kindness, and building community.

This online-offsite hybrid course includes a four-day mindfulness meditation retreat at Starved Rock State Park in Utica, IL **May 29 – June 1**, as well as online learning activities throughout the quarter. Mindfulness meditation is a

popular practice that can help build our attention and reduce our reactivity to life stressors. It is widely studied by neuroscientists, psychologists, philosophers, and others interested in a contemporary, secular approach to meditation.

The four-day in-person retreat allows students time to apply class learning in a longer immersive experience and deepen their understanding of the material covered online. By applying the characteristics of experiential learning to the mindfulness practice, you can develop a deeper and more meaningful engagement with mindfulness.

In addition to the regular tuition, students pay a \$775 fee that covers three nights of housing at Starved Rock Lodge and two group meals. Students are responsible for the costs of the rest of their meals at the Lodge's cafe or restaurant. Students will have their own room/bath with a small refrigerator and microwave. Students are responsible for their own transportation to and from Starved Rock. For additional information contact jcantwel@depaul.edu before enrolling.
