Visit plazas, schools and cafes in Jamaica, and learn how people interact with each other in different settings. In this study abroad program, participants will analyze first-hand the dynamics of communication. On-site visits to schools and music venues, interaction with students from universities, and pre-departure readings and workshops vividly demonstrate the intercultural aspects of communication. At the end of this experience, participants will be able to analyze social and cultural influences on interaction patterns in educational and public places. SNL students register for three to four competencies (H1A, H2X, H2A, H2E, H5, FX, E1 & E2 and L10 & L11), and non-SNL students register for eight credits, two sections of INT 399 (JYEL).
